


SUMMER READING CLUB

This year's Summer Reading Club was another success for the books, largely thanks to a \$2,500 programming donation provided by the Friends. The library gave out fun take-home prizes to Reading Challenge participants and awarded larger gifts to drawing winners at each branch location. A combined 1,379 attendees enjoyed 41 in-person programs throughout summer, including "Radical a kick-off event with Reptiles" Reptile Smiles, instruction in the nighttime sounds of Garrett County presented by Kevin Dodge, and an introduction to instruments from around the world (with hands-on session at the end!) with Dr. Sean Beachy. The library continues to be beyond grateful to the Friends for their ongoing Summer Reading Club support.
